The Beginning...

The Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, Southern Jurisdiction, initiated a program in the early 1950s in Colorado to help children with speech and language disorders. This program led to the establishment of RiteCare clinics throughout the Southern Jurisdiction to provide diagnostic evaluation and treatment of speech and language disorders and learning disabilities.

Today, there are 178 RiteCare® clinics, centers, and special programs operating or planned for children and therapists located throughout the United States.

Tens of thousands of youngsters across the United States have been served. Children who might have remained educationally behind for a lifetime can now talk, read, and lead productive lives.



The Hileman Family...



My name is Trish Hileman. I am the wife of Stephen Hileman and the mom to 5 kids. Bram 12, Evan and David 10, Joseph 7 and Adeline 4.

Evan and David have attended WSU's RiteCare clinic since they were just 3 years old and worked continuously until they were 9. We then transitioned their therapy to their school. Evan and David work in a typical 5th grade classroom, today, doing all the same academic work as their peers, even though they have



autism – because of our intensive work with them. (Trish Hileman spoke at our 2013 Champagne and Chocolate Benefit.)

The WSU Difference...

Hileman and others contend that WSU therapy is set apart from many of the other speech services provided in Wichita. At WSU, graduate clinical students are taught and clients benefit from their cutting edge methods and research based approaches; but parents also learn how to help their children by learning how to "do" speech at home. This is the primary reason families like the Hilemans and Lindseys recommend WSU to others in the community. The culture of education is so pervasive at the clinic. Hileman says, "I don't just drop off my children to 'get' their speech, I get to watch, listen, ask questions and make sure I understand how to apply what they are working on and learning to our home environment."



WSU is structured to provide sliding scale services so families don't have to worry if they are going to get turned away "because their insurance isn't 'good enough'", or "that they just lost their job, or that they can't get \$640 more dollars out of their monthly budget." As Hileman contends, "parents want the best for their children, tough choices have to be made for their families and food and shelter have to come first."

What We Can Do...

What **we** can do is share our financial resources and support this challenging but important work. Hileman declares "Communicating effectively is an amazing gift and it isn't one I take lightly". 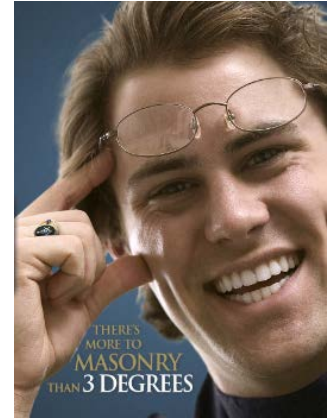


Allegiance
