In the last Double Eagle I spoke about our financial opportunities with the budget, and promised you an update on what we plan to do. Our Treasurer, David Bernstorf, KCCH has given us a report on our financial performance over the last several years and shown where our revenues and expenses come from and what has happened to them since 2010. You will find his report and charts in this newsletter.

David, Jim Davenport, 33°, Executive Secretary, and I have been meeting weekly to review the financial status and to look for areas that might need some adjustment. To be honest there have not been any great revelations or areas that we felt were not under control. Our Strategic Planning team will be looking at our overall business plan to see where we might be able to improve our marketing efforts for our rentals as well as ways to generate new revenue streams. This process is already underway and is a part of our overall plan to ensure that we are on the right course and can keep improving our situation. It is not an easy task, we have been down this road before and have managed to pull ourselves through, but it has taken some hard work and very difficult decisions on the part of those who were in leadership positions at the time.

Fiscal Responsibility involves us ALL

The two main sources of revenue are dues and rentals, fortunately both of these are within our capability to impact. Dues simply translates to membership, I have included our membership numbers from 2010 to present so you can see that we have been consistently losing members at a rate of about 7% a year.

- 2010 = 2576 members
- 2011 = 2378 members
- 2012 = 2210 members
- 2013 = 2233 members

as of July 31, 2013 (198 unpaid and potential suspensions at the end of the year).

We need to reverse that trend, and start increasing our membership if we are to survive as an organization. It is easy to say, not so easy to do, but that is where we need to put our resources and our focus. Membership is important not only because of the dues income, if we cannot attract new members then it won't matter

whether we have money or not, we will no longer be a viable organization and we will cease to exist. It is not unheard of, I can name several fraternal organizations that were thriving for many years and are now no longer in existence, it can happen, we need to make sure that it does not happen to us! We are working on developing new ways to getting our message to the right audience and making sure we are not left out when a new Master Mason is looking for additional light in Masonry. You will be hearing more about some of these efforts in future newsletters, but keep an eye on our website and look for us on Facebook™ that is where we will be spreading the word about Scottish Rite Masonry.

By the way, your first chance to help us increase our membership is coming up October 11 & 12 with our Fall Reunion. Go talk to that man you have been thinking about approaching and encourage him to join us in October!

The second main source of revenue is rentals, while we have been doing well with our rental program; there is more that we could do. To help attract additional rentals we continue to make improvements to the Center and to reach out to groups that may not have considered us in the past. We have upgraded the Stage and Auditorium lighting as well as the stage itself in order to attract more theatre groups to use our facility. We have the premier live performance theatre in Wichita, and we now have one of the most technically modern stages; we plan to market this to the local theatre groups in Wichita and the surrounding area. We will be reaching out to the business community later this year with an open house specifically designed to showcase our capability to host business meetings, seminars or large conferences. We think that this is an area where we can significantly improve

CREATIVE MEANS TO STRETCH OUR CARPET & COSTS

For the first time since 1907, the gutters holding the stage lights have been taken down and replaced. The new gutters above the stage now hold modern LED lighting which significantly lowers the amount of wattage being used on stage; the new lights are cooler, and they allow for more control from the light board. The investment updates our stage so that it will be more attractive to renters who might be interested in having musical and theatrical performances. The carpeting on the stage is also being replaced by Masonite flooring, and the spare carpet left from the stage has been used to re-carpet a section of the library. We do what we can to recycle - and the "new" carpet in the library looks great! The Masonite flooring will also be more attractive to renters wishing to have traditional dance performances on our stage. These renters help out our bottom line A LOT - so these improvements are well worth the effort. 

our rental income and is an area that we have not been able to take advantage of in the past due to a lack of weekday parking. With the parking situation resolved and the additional technical capabilities we have in the building we can now pursue the business functions.

We need to continue to maintain and upgrade the Center in order to attract both the wedding and business events, that is not an inexpensive venture either! We are reviewing our current and proposed projects to ensure that we are doing the most beneficial and/or necessary projects so that we get the greatest return on our investment. We have some onGoing projects that need to be done in order to keep the building structurally sound and appealing to the eye. While these may not be the most glamorous projects, they are necessary if we want to keep the inside of the building in good condition. These projects, as I said last time, do not impact our operating budget directly, but they provide the necessary infrastructure that allows us to function both as a business and a Fraternity. The "Building the Future" (BTF) program was created in 2007, to help fund the restoration and preservation of our building as well as provide funds to the Wichita State University RiteCare™ Clinic. Donations and bequests are our main sources of funds for doing work on the building and those come from all of us. If you have not yet donated to the BTF, I encourage you to consider it; we have materials available that explains the program and why we are pursuing it. Large or small, all donations are important and very much appreciated; you may donate in a number of ways, which are explained in the literature. I like the Ben Franklin Club myself, you donate a \$100 at whatever pace you are comfortable with, I try to donate monthly, personal finances allowing, but the frequency is up to you. When you donate your first \$100 we will give you a nice wood plaque and a sticker to place on the plaque to show your donation, when you have donated \$1000 the plaque will be full and you can proudly show your contribution to the Scottish Rite to your friends!

Obviously, your financial support is important, but we can use your talents as well; volunteers to help with the never ending line of small jobs to be done around the Center are always welcome, and very much appreciated! You have seen some of our volunteers showcased in the last newsletter and we cannot thank them enough for their time and efforts, without them jobs simply would not get done because of a lack of time. Our paid staff are always busy cleaning up from the last event and getting ready for the next one, or fixing some piece of 75 year old equipment that has decided to quit working. If you have the time and would like to help out, contact Jim Davenport, Executive Secretary, and I am sure he will be able to find a spot for you. Our volunteers save us a considerable amount of money by not having to hire someone or to work our staff overtime so they can do the job. Talk to Ross Smith, 33° or Van McLemore, 33° about what they do at the Center and how they feel about it. It is a great way to help out the Scottish Rite Center and can also be great way to spend some quality time with some of your friends and brothers!

We have "opportunities" to deal with, but we will deal with them, and move on to the next challenge as we have always done before and will do in the future when the next generation takes the reins. As always, thank you for your support and encouragement, it means a great deal to all of us at the Center!

Be sure to check the calendar for upcoming events, we are getting back into action after being dark and you don't want to miss any of the exciting events we have coming up!

I wanted to give you an update on finance's for this fiscal year. The update provides additional information to the Personal Representative's comments from the July/August 2013 Double Eagle.

The plot shows three years of actuals, each year ending September 30th. The 2013 numbers are estimated based on actual numbers through July 31st. The chart includes expenses and revenues for the General Fund only. Investment, Life Endowment, and Wichita Scottish Rite Charitable Trust amounts are not included. The gap between the expenses and revenues comes from investment income when possible and by withdrawing principal from the investment account to cover expenses only when required. The five principle revenue sources are shown: Dues, Lease, Parking, Building Rental, and Mineral Royalties. The remaining revenue comes from six to ten other sources, which cumulative provide less than 10% of the total revenue.

Regular meetings between the Personal Representative, Executive Secretary, and the Treasurer review the current Expenses and Revenues leading to the recommended budget for 2013-2014 for Elmo Lodge. Expenses have been minimized in next year's budget.

We are looking at increasing revenue through more members generating additional dues income and attracting more business meetings through the week to increase rental income.
