State of the printed Double Eagle Newsletter

The Wichita Scottish Rite like many fraternal organizations is struggling with its finances. Many of our Brothers feel a newsletter is essential to keep all of our Brothers up-to-date on what is going on. Unfortunately there is no budget for the newsletter. The most economical method is by email. Currently we have email addresses for 600 of our 1800 members. It cost approximately \$1.50 per issue to print and mail the newsletter to each of our 1200 members using an outside contractor. If we can get 4 to 8 Brothers to volunteer to help print, collate, fold, and mail the newsletters in-house we hope to save half or more of this cost. DID YOU KNOW?

A look at our Wichita Scottish Rite archive room.

We have been asked to write about some of the items that we have in the Wichita Scottish Rite (WSR) archive room that Brother Ross Smith and I have uncovered in our search through the archival material. We have spent the last couple of years trying to organize all of the material and have come across numerous items and information that Ross and I were not aware of, and Ross has 85 years of WSR history here in the building, starting at 5 years old when he played a school-boy in one of the old 32° Tableaus.

Our archival room is located on the second floor in the hall directly behind the main dining room orchestra balcony. Inside the archive room and other locations around the building we have sorted and documented the following items:

Class pictures dating back to 1895. The older pictures are interesting since most of the pictures through the 1950's were taken on the outside of the building and we can see the progress of various additions and upgrades to the building. The clothing styles through the years are also interesting to note. The largest class was the Spring 1944 Lieutenant Clifford Victor Hunt, Jr. Class, which included 669 members. Lieutenant Hunt, 32°, USNR, was the first WSR member killed in the Second World War. Can you imagine the main dining hall with 669 members, their wives or girlfriends, other WSR members and guests with their wives or girlfriends, and staff? In November of 1927, there were noted 1,200 present in the main dining room for the class banquet. There are also old, very large (and heavy) framed class pictures. It is not known where these might have been hung. Possibly in the old open reception room (now main office) or the walls of the main dining room. Our class pictures include 32º class reunions, KCCH honors classes, and 330 honors classes. There is also a large folder of individual member pictures.

Class reunion books and pamphlets dating back to the 1880's, including reunion books and

pamphlets from other Valleys and Orients. The WSR reunion books up to the 1960's were bound booklets including reports from the various class officers, the class picture, the reunion schedule in detail, and various other pictures and information for the new member. These bound booklets were sent out to the new members after the class as a souvenir of the experience that they went through. There was a separate "Working Program" used during the reunion that listed the degrees and degree dates and times for use by the staff, actors, and workers. Up through the 1950's, the class had a number of different officers and committees. These included a President, Vice President, Class Historian, Class Orator, Class Motto, Class Music, Class History, Class Reunion, and several other offices and committees. This kept the entire class busy with different offices and committees. At that time a class could be 4 or 5 consecutive days (and nights), or several weekends. The first WSR class was held on January 18, 1888, with 22 new members. Fall 2016 will be our 344th class reunion.

In the safe in the main office, we have books of meeting minutes from Elmo Lodge of Perfection No. 9 (ELOP). These books date back to the first meeting held in June of 1887. The early meeting minutes are in beautiful flowing cursive script handwriting and it takes a while to decipher what they are writing. We have written down various milestone items from the meeting minutes to give us a time line of events throughout our history. There are also meeting minutes from the other coordinate bodies. Originally, the four coordinate bodies had separate meetings; performed all duties separately; had separate trustees; separate degree work; and paid bills separately. In January 1898, this changed to empower ELOP to act as the sole governing body of WSR. At one meeting in November, 1946, there were 350 members noted in attendance at the ELOP meeting. After the meeting, they would serve snacks and sandwiches, and sometimes they would serve meals.

Copies of the Scottish Rite "New Age Magazine" dating back to 1915. This magazine was changed to the "Scottish Rite Journal" starting about 1990, which we also have copies of in the room. There are also complete bound books of the New Age Magazine in our Library on the fourth floor.

Copies of the Wichita Scottish Rite Double Eagle newsletter dating back to September 1935. These are very interesting to read since they contain many articles and photographs that pertain to our history. There were also articles from the Secretary on events happening around the building, along with articles from the heads of the coordinate bodies, the Personal Representative, and the S.G.I.G. in Kansas.

There is a small library of miscellaneous Masonic books dealing with the Scottish Rite, the Blue Lodge, and other subjects. We also have copies of Morals and Dogma books dating back to 1903, and sign in registers and class rosters for the class reunions and ELOP meetings dating back to 1904.

We have Patents that were given to members honoring their 32°, KCCH honors, 33° honors, and 50 year memberships. The earliest Patent date that we have is April 11, 1895. The Patents are mainly in English, but we also have Patents that are in Latin. According to old reunion books, Patents years ago were issued in both English and Latin. The Latin version was to display, and there was a smaller English version to fold and carry with you. Members would lay out Patents during reunions and other members would then sign their names to the Patents. Most of the patents that we have come to us from donations. but some of these were not delivered because of address changes when mailed, when a correct address was not known. We also have Patents that were issued to the wife, daughter, or sister of a member on application from the member, entitling them to the protection of the Rite when occasion required. These date from 1912. We welcome you to look through our list to see if any of the Patents should go to family members that you might know of.

Copies of old building plans are located in file drawers. These include partial building plans and exterior elevations of the original Y.M.C.A. building; the 1908 addition; the 1954 addition; and the Albert Pike Lodge addition. There are also copies of old specifications for the additions.

We have a book of pictures of both the exterior of the building and areas around the interior of the building that have been taken through the years. These are interesting to look at to see how some of the areas in the building have changed and have been remodeled to serve other functions. These include the auditorium that was in the original Y.M.C.A. portion of the building showing how the auditorium and stage were arranged. This location is now the Lodge room, foyer, and outside seating area on the third floor in the original Y.M.C.A. portion of the building.

We have original abstracts of our present property dating back to the mid 1800's when the land was titled as a part of the "Osage Indian"

Land Trust". The land was originally purchased by J.R. Mead, one of Wichita's founding fathers.

This is not an inclusive list of everything that we have gone through, just a generalization of the items. We are still coming up with items that are found around the building. There are also numerous miscellaneous items that we have documented. We welcome anyone to come and go through our archive room and look through the various items that we have.

We will be having a series of future articles that will deal with a time line of events throughout our WSR history. Please be looking for these and give us any comments that you may have if you find anything in error, or if you have further information on any of the items.


